

Musical Groups

Outdoors or in a large indoor area

Draw or mark out large shapes on the ground

Play music and instruct children to move around the area in different ways (as they choose, like animals, physical skills, etc.)

When the music stops children have to move into a shape

Ask children a question such as:

- How many people are in your group? How do you know?
- Do you have more or less children in your group than the group next to you?
- How many hands are in your group?
- How many girls, how many boys are in your group?
- How can we make each group the same? Do some of you need to move to a different group? How can we do this?

After each question, play the music again and children need to move in a different way.

Stop music and children should move to a shape, once again

Ask another auestion

Repeat
